Welcome to 2005 and this 10th Edition of the Board Bulletin

This publication offers the Board's 2004 Annual Report and other information specifically designed to increase the level of licensee and public awareness relative to the responsibilities and obligations of both. The Board will make every effort possible to assure current issues that impact licensees and consumers alike are disseminated in an expeditious manner.

Calendar year 2004 unfortunately echoes a similar bleak financial picture for the state and a yet to be determined utilization of available funding. As of this date there is no indication that deductions will be derived from self-sufficient 90-10 Board funds. On a more positive note, I do not foresee a request for increasing fees at this time however, continuance of all existing programs. The passage of Senate Bill 1043 in May of 1998 created a firm foundation for the Board and its members. All those involved should be applauded for their efforts. I take my fiduciary responsibility very seriously and will always strive to give licensees and consumers more for less.

Being a member of the "baby boomers" generation has caused me to make dynamic changes in my life impacting both my personal and family life. And the impact upon the funeral industry will be none the less if recent and past prognostications hold true. Inconsistent regulation combined with the ineffective actions of a small percentage of industry members has created an enormous zeal for consumers to proceed simultaneously to litigation and monetary rewards. Recently, several consumers have attempted to strengthen ones civil position by filing complaints through the Board in efforts to obtain more support for their cause. If a violation of funeral law has in fact occurred then a complainant should immediately seek remedy. A civil filing is something that everyone is entitled to and when applicable can be sought out in a timely manner. The future of the industry indicates that an error, act of insensitivity or miscommunications with a client family may lead to damages more frequently in the years to come.

Industry members must always remember for consumers, a funeral service contract may be one of their largest purchases, but each service has a long lasting emotional memory. The trust that is given to each of our licensees and establishments during this time of grieving can never be broken. Most families are not prepared or ready to speak of death until the time of need. You can not endanger your integrity or lose the confidence of consumers because you failed to meet the standards of the prevailing industry. With this being said, I give you my solemn promise to make every effort to educate, and reinvigorate all licensees of their obligations and requirement of laws to make this state one of the finest states involved in the funeral industry. And lastly, those willing to violate the laws should understand the potential outcomes. The State of Arizona has come a long ways in the past several years and I hope to continue current trends. Again, the Board's Staff stands committed to providing optimum service to all those it serves.

BOARD VISION

To create and maintain a balance between fair and equitable business regulation and the protection of the public's health, safety and welfare in the use and purchase of goods and services required for death.

PHILOSOPHY

To maximize public protection through education and minimal regulation.

BOARD MISSION

To maintain and enforce a set of standards that provides protection for the health, safety and welfare of Arizona Citizens by educating the consumer and by actively and impartially regulating those licensed to provide funeral goods and services.

BOARD STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS

1. To ensure that where regulation is required that consumers are only accessing licensed Businesses or Individuals and that licenses are only granted and renewed to competent Individuals with high standards of professional and ethical conduct.
2. To ensure and enforce that information is made available to both the consumer and the Licensee that educates them to the standards of practice, their rights and obligations.
3. To actively and impartially investigate and resolve allegations and complaints, and provide enforcement to protect the public from incompetent services, unprofessional, unethical and illegal conduct.

BOARD DESCRIPTION

The State Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers examines and licenses individuals who provide funeral goods and services. The Board accepts complaints against licensed individuals, establishments in-

cluding staff, investigate allegations, and forwards complaints of criminal/civil matters to appropriate authorities. The Board oversees approximately 1500 licensees practicing in the state, and serves all Arizona citizens who receive funeral goods and services.

BOARD STATUTORY FUNDING FORMULA

ARS 32-1308 requires that all fees and revenues accruing to the Board be paid to the State Treasurer. Ninety percent of the fees are paid to the Board's fund to cover operational fees and one hundred percent of civil penalties are deposited in the State's general fund. For fiscal year 2004, ninety percent represents the Board's appropriated budget of \$268,800 however nearly \$412,000 was collected. With ten percent at approximately \$41,000, plus civil penalties estimated at \$5,000, the Board is returning at least \$46,000 to the State's general fund.

BOARD COMPOSITION

The Board is comprised of four qualified and practicing funeral directors and three consumers, one of which must be the owner or manager of a business. Board Members are appointed by the Governor and serve four-year terms with annual elections for President and Secretary.

STAFFING & BUDGET

The Board maintains four full time positions. An Executive Director responsible for overall administration, a Deputy Director responsible for investigations and continuity of operations during the Directors absence, a Compliance Administrator responsible for the evaluations of all licensed establishments and a Licensing Coordinator responsible for licensing and continuing education. The Board was fully staffed during the reporting period.

The Board's appropriation for FY 2004 was \$268,800 and \$285,300 for FY 2005.

ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

This section has been renamed and the scope of information provided will be centered on current procedural or statutory modifications to keep licensees in compliance. The following information has been received from the Office of Vital Registration referencing Title 36, Chapter 3 of Arizona Revised Statutes and effective August 2004:

- Since physicians and nurse practitioners have three days to certify a cause of death, **funeral establishments now have seven days to register a death certificate with the Registers Office.** Take the time to obtain all required information and insure data integrity.

- **Nurse Practitioners** who have completed the online course via the Board of Nursing website **may now certify cause of death as well.**

- **Definition of “Family Member”** has been extended to include spouse, maternal or adopted offspring, father, mother, grandparent, grandchild to any degree, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, cousin. You may apply on behalf of these family members so please obtain documentation that proves their relationship to the decedent and maintain in your files. The documentation need not be submitted with each request; however, there have been incidents where the office has had to make requests for it.

- **Funeral establishments or responsible persons may move human remains** from a hospital, nursing care institution or hospice inpatient facility where a death occurred from one registration district (county) to another (county) **within the state as long as the registration (county) where the death occurred receives notice within 24 hours after moving the human remains.** This means that you are not required to call for permission to transport from one county to another county outside of normal business hours. Please note that disposition may

not occur without first obtaining a permit number.

The Office of Vital Records has additionally requested the following reminders:

- Please obtain proof and documentation from family member when applying for death certificates on their behalf. These should be maintained in your files.
- It is essential that fax requests for permit numbers be received in ample time prior to a disposition for the Office of Vital Records and Medical Examiners Office.
- Please advise employees to review and double check all death certificates prior to submission. The most common errors are disposition date, social security numbers, wrong permit numbers and obvious spelling errors.
- When leaving phone messages please provide the decedent’s name, permit number and detailed request.

Another reminder, Arizona Revised Statutes 32-1398 A. (1.) is included which states “The Board may take disciplinary action against a crematory or an agent or employee of a crematory for any of the following acts: “Unless otherwise permitted by law, **selling or offering to sell a cremation that is not arranged by a funeral establishment licensed pursuant to article 4 of this chapter**”. Compliance of this statute affords protection for consumers and licensee alike. When it was brought to the Boards attention that many organizations under the jurisdiction of the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act were processing cremations directly through licensed crematories it became a situation that required immediate attention. The law as it is written was for the purpose of preventing unlawful or unauthorized cremations. Therefore, the Responsible Funeral Director shall ensure that proper authorization is obtained and secure necessary documentation required for final disposition.

Recent complaints filed by consumers and random samplings of documentation by our Compliance Administrator have revealed the omissions and incompleteness of embalming reports. These reports must not only be completed in a timely manner but include detailed information concerning the remains and procedure itself. Include a thorough description of the condition of the body and any difficulties with embalming or other abnormal condition observed. The additional time utilized to complete this form may prove to be one of your most proactive defenses in the future.

Lastly, please make copies of the transits permits and authorization to embalm in your case file for review by the Compliance Administer. And please do not forget to include your funeral directors license number along with your signature on the Statement of Goods and Services.

LAWS AND RULES

Last year House Bill 2637 sponsored by Representative Bob Stump was introduced before the House Health Committee and was unanimously approved. This bill would have placed any facility that stores human bodies for more than five years under the regulatory authority of the State Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers. While introduced in the Senate Committee, the bill was terminated. At present there are no future plans to seek regulatory authority in this area.

The Arizona Funeral Directors Association is sponsoring a bill which could possibly authorize the regulation of Casket Stores by the Board. Briefly, the proposed bill would give the Board regulatory and investigative powers identical to those impacting on current licensees and registrants upon Casket Store owners. They would not be licensed at this time however, regulated to the point of existing statures with a few amendments to A.R.S. 44-1799.21 relative to Casket sales and price disclosure.

A Notice of Rulemaking was filed February 9, 2005 by the Board. This particular change was a result of the Auditor General's Sunset Review conducted last year. The rule modification will provide time frames for correcting deficiencies and steps in the disciplinary process for non compliance.

IMMUNITY DOCUMENT

A.R.S. 32-1365.01

The Board's Staff continues to receive questions relative to A.R.S. 32-1365.01 more commonly know as the Immunity Document. Therefore, we feel it is imperative to again reemphasize the value of utilization of the statute. A signed dated prearranged cremation plan by a funeral trust, insurance or other financial arrangement will alone not suffice, if upon death no spouse is present or a challenge by siblings exists. However, if you have followed the guidelines provided in the law and include similar language you will be immune to criminal and civil liability and not be subject to professional discipline. If you have any questions do not hesitate to call the office for assistance. A legally competent adult may prepare a competent adult's remains. This written statement may but need not be part of the competent adult's will. The legally competent adult shall sign and date the

document. The document shall be notarized or witnessed in writing by at least one adult affirming that the notary or witness was present when the competent adult signed and dated the document and that the competent adult appeared to be of sound mind and free from duress at the time of execution of the document.

The document that conforms to this section authorizes a crematory, cemetery or funeral establishment to carry out the wishes of the competent adult who is the subject of the document. It is not necessary for a crematory, cemetery or funeral establishment to obtain the consent or concurrence of any other person when it cremates or provides for the lawful disposition of a dead human body pursuant to instructions contained in a document that conforms to this section.

This section does not mandate that a crematory, cemetery or funeral establishment cremate or otherwise provide for the lawful disposition of a dead human body pursuant to the document unless the legally competent adult who executed the document made any financial arrangements necessary to effectuate the legally competent adult's wishes as expressed in the document.

A crematory, cemetery or funeral establishment that cremates or otherwise provides for the lawful disposition of a dead human body in good faith reliance on an apparently genuine document executed pursuant to this section is immune from criminal and civil liability and is not subject to professional discipline. The decision of a crematory, cemetery or funeral establishment to cremate or otherwise provide for the lawful disposition of a dead human body in reliance on a document executed pursuant to this section is presumed to be made in good faith.

OTHER AGENCY IMPROVEMENTS

The State Board's Office has redesigned its current web site to reflect that of the State of Arizona. Take a little time to browse at this informative site. The address is www.funeralbd.state.az.us.

Within the next couple of months of this issue the Board will have modified its current web site to include additional information on-line. Modifications on the site will provide accessibility to users who wish to query the name of current licensees and registrants. The queries can be accomplished through a name, or simply by listing an alphabetical letter for example, all last names that begin with the letter R. In addition an establishment, licensee, or registrant disciplinary history will also be available. There will be no access to personal addresses or phone numbers however the type and date of license renewal will be available.


